






Conference venues

The conference will be organized in two places: European Solidarity Centre on *Thursday*, and at the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Gdańsk on *Friday* and *Saturday*.

European Solidarity Centre (ECS at the attached map; address: *Solidarity Square 1*) is located within a walk distance from the "Main Railway Station," and from the Old Town Area.

The main campus of the University of Gdańsk is located around 7-8 km from the European Solidarity Centre. Faculty of Social Sciences (building "D" at the map below; address: Jana Bazynskiego Street 4) is located near of the "Przymorze-Uniwersytet Railway Station."

The fastest way to travel between ECS and the university campus is SKM RAPID URBAN RAILWAY (link attached). A trip from the "Railway Main Station" to the "Uniwersytet-Przymorze Railway Station" takes 12 min, and trains go each 7 min during rush hours, and each 15 min during off-peak.

It will be organized in the historical building of the summer residence of the bishop (now operated by the Bridgettine Order).
