

CALL FOR PAPERS

- Extended abstracts (2-4 pages) in PDF format, prepared for blind review should be sent to mkastefaniak@gmail.com by July 20, 2018.
 Please indicate how much time you would need to present (30/40/50 minutes).
- Submissions to the student session should have 1-3 pages and should be clearly marked as such.
- Acceptance notifications will be sent by August 1, 2018
- Papers will be followed by 10 minute commentaries prepared beforehand by another participant and a discussion. Participants might also be asked to comment on at least one talk. We aim to make the short versions of accepted papers available to the participants ahead of the conference.
- Students will have 25 minutes to present, followed by 5 minutes of commentary and 10 minutes of discussion.

WORKSHOP SERIES

This is the seventh conference in the ∃ntia et Nomin∀ series (previous editions took place in Poland, Belgium and India), which features workshops for researchers in formally and analytically oriented philosophy, in particular in epistemology, logic, and philosophy of science. The distinctive format of the workshop requires participants to distribute extended abstracts or full papers a couple of weeks before the workshop and to prepare extended comments on another participant's paper.

THIS EDITION

This year, the workshop is supported by the National Science Center SONATA BIS grant titled Conceptual, formal, and practical aspects of forensic and judicial applications of probabilistic tools. For this reason, we would like philosophers working in epistemology, logic and philosophy of science to interact with researchers working on issues related to the project.

While we're happy to receive regular submissions from graduate students, the workshop will also include a graduate student session. For this session we welcome submissions in English or in Polish.
